Editorial

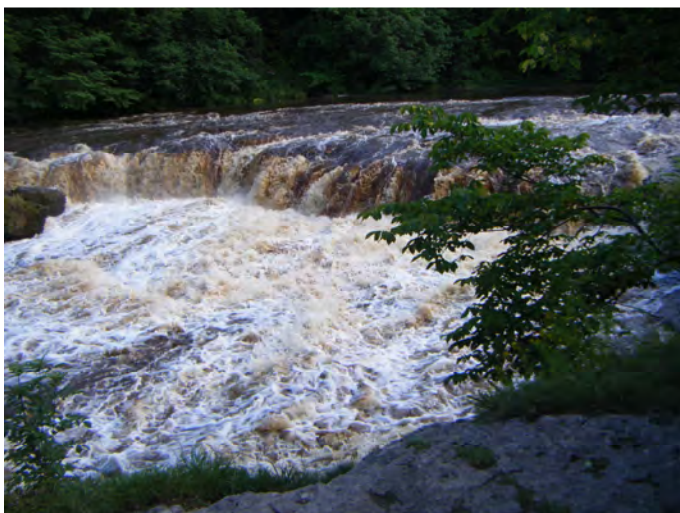
My advice is not to go fishing the week that I have a fishing holiday.

This was the hottest match of the year so far (30 degrees). You could have made a cup of tea on the top two feet of water.

There had been a delivery of 2,000 fish at Middlemead two day earlier and all boats headed to Middlemead from the off. These were fairly small fish and the average size was only 1lb 11oz

Rods were bent within the first ten minutes and everyone thought they'd be back at the lodge by 11.00am.

Boat pressure soon put paid to that idea.

With little wind the field spread out in Middlemead with the occasional rod bending.

However about 2.0pm the fish moved back into the area and it was 'fill your boots' time.

An inquiring phone call elicited this additional information:- The fish had been stocked to the left (Nature Reserve side) of Middlemead and that was the place to be.

Contrary to what might have been expected on such a hot day DI7's and attractors were not essential. Slow sinkers and floating lines were effective. This may have been due to the lack of wind which gave leaders and flies plenty of time to drop down below the hot water

Also nymphs were as effective as blobs and sparklers etc.

Two rounds to go and any of four teams could be Champions

Only Three Anglers Fail to Catch Limit on Ridiculously Easy Grafham Group Two – Round Four

I'm sure we have all experienced days when the fish are so suicidal that almost every cast results in a fish.

A couple of years ago I caught seven fish in 32 casts on Rutland. It must have been like that on Grafham for the Group Two Round Four Match.

It was so ridiculous that 37.6% of the weight was time bonus!

Surprisingly this had little effect on the placings. The actual bag weight of the first three teams – excluding time bonus would have placed them in the same positions. (**Bag weight only**) Grafham 90lbs 14oz – Navy/Marines 78lbs 8oz Soldier Palmers 73lbs 14oz - Only Queen Mother F.F. (20lbs time bonus weight) gave them an advantage over last place Bewl 'B' (8lbs time bonus) even though they had fewer fish.

The home team (GWFFA) had a clean sweep. Best Team – Best Bag – Best Fish.



With an average size of only 1lb 11oz it is clear that fish from a new stocking made up the majority of the fish caught. Mark Glass' best fish only weighed 1lb 8oz.

There has been no official report but I have discovered that blobs etc. caught fish very quickly. That nymphs etc. also caught but rather more slowly. Additionally, as is typical with a shoal of stock fish that is harried, rods who did not catch quickly found it more and more difficult in the afternoon.

However after 912 individual hours of fishing on Eyebrook **one person** – Chris McLeod of Invicta 'A' caught a limit.



A quarter of the fish caught in the match were caught by three anglers. Chris – Clive Collier (5 in the same boat) and Simon Newman (6) both of Iver.

Chris has fished twice this year (so far) and is on a bit of a roll! He was top rod overall at the Spring Match and top rod again in this Group Match.

Ron Lusardi reports that most anglers fished in the main bowl and although a few fish were caught on lures and nymphs, dry flies were the most successful method.

Chris reports that he started with a bushy olive seal's fur CDC for his first two fish. The third hooked itself on a bit on the middle dropper, but as there was no other interest he changed to a small hare's ear which took the last two fish. The other kept coming to the bushy alive CDC.

Both Clive and Simon started with dries but by early afternoon the rise stooped. For the last half hour Clive changed to a damsel booby and damsel for two late fish.

Fish Hawks 'B' remain in pole position with a four point lead and only two rounds remaining. A bad result for them in the next round could provide an

interesting Autumn Match.

Sod's law suggest that either I do not have any information, or too much. With three excellent reports from anglers who fished in this match I have an abundance of information.

Dave Summers (England Police) says *'my plan was to drift out from P Buoy near the Sailing Club out across the main basin. David Moore (Invicta) says 'We headed up towards the middle of the Dam which was a bit crowded even before the competition boats arrived'. John Caldwell informed me that 'Steve Middleton and I spent all day drifting the main bowl from the Sailing Club corner of the Dam towards Pitsford Creek'.*

I think one can assume that the fish were at the Dam end across the main bowl and over deep water.

There was unanimity about where the fish were to be found. *'I know that the fish were high in the water and were spread out' (Dave*

Summers). 'The fish seemed to be fairly widespread across the area' (John). There was also agreement that it was not necessary to fish deep. Dave Summers kept his flies 'working high up in the water'. John's boat partner 'used a floating line with a booby on the point' and David Moore used a floating damsel nymph on the top dropper 'a diawl bach below it and a very small cat's booby on the point with a floating line'

Almost every fly caught! Two Tequila Blobs for Dave Summers. Floating Damsel Nymphs for David Moore and Daiwl Bachs for John and his boat partner.
